

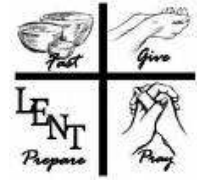

We are in our second week of Lent. As we work on Repentance, Renewal and Redemption our students and staff continue to focus on seeing the positive in each other and choosing a kind, gentle way to talk with classmates.
