Maybe ordinary is not so ordinary...

As we enter Ordinary Time after the Advent and Christmas Seasons, one would hope to be able to coast for a while in an ordinary manner. And yet...



Just a typical wedding at Cana develops into Jesus' first miracle of changing water into wine. Isaiah speaks a truth as he says, "For Zion's sake I WILL NOT BE SILENT!" St. Paul in 1 Corinthians proclaims that there are many spiritual gifts

and forms of service and yet the same God who produces all of them. There is NO ordinary in any of this and it is Ordinary Time!!!

This has me reflecting on a few things that are active in our world today.

The first is the death of President Jimmy Carter. From what seemed like a quiet, unassuming man, there came forth spiritual gifts and a servant heart that is still being felt today after his many years of "retirement." Who says politicians need to be loud clangs that bear little fruit in the real world.

The second is the extraordinary fire situation in the Los Angeles area. Millions of people were living their ordinary lives. One could never predict this type of situation and yet it is now very real to so many people who lost their lives and/or their homes.

The third is the celebration of Martin Luther King Day this Monday. Out of the "ordinary" experience of a gentle man of God, came a storm of dreams and reality checks for our society. Isaiah would not be silent for the good of God's people and MLK followed in the footsteps of this great prophet. How do we unshackle the binding racial prejudices that divide instead of unite. We are stuck in the messy, unjust ordinariness that is not of God's salvation. That is not God's dream for us. Can we hear the voice of another person of a different skin color or gender and still be able to hear the same Spirit dwelling within all of us? That is my dream.

Breaking through our ordinary ways of seeing reality is the only way we will truly build the reign of God upon this earth. Our Baptism calls us to be one with all who are of God.
