Selling Everything

In the summer of 1994, as the new Director of Youth Ministry for the Diocese of Green Bay, I led a group of high school young people and adults on a new service immersion experience called Young Neighbors in Action, sponsored by the Center for Ministry Development. Our group traveled to Hartford, Connecticut, to experience how poverty was manifested there so that we could have our eyes, ears, and hearts newly opened to our experience of poverty in Green Bay and Appleton. Most of the young people came from parishes in Appleton and Waupaca. We had a great experience of serving the poor but also learned why we serve.



Yet, this is where life became increasingly interesting. Upon our return one of the high school girls from Appleton took to heart a call to simplify her life. She emptied all her closets and dresser drawers with the intent of donating everything she owned to Goodwill. Needless to say, her parents had some issues with this and wondered what we had done to their daughter! As adult leaders we quickly called an emergency meeting of all fifteen participants, processing how they were responding to their mountaintop experience of this trip. We implored the young people to take seriously the challenge to simplify their lives. Yet, we also emphasized that they needed some resources in their lives, such as shelter, clothing, food, and other items in order to be in a position to serve the poor. We also instructed them that, rather than totally emptying their closets, perhaps they could donate something when they went to the mall and purchased a new article of clothing.

This weekend, the Gospel passage from St. Mark includes the familiar story of the rich young man who approaches Jesus with the ultimate question of how to gain eternal life. Jesus reminds him of the teaching to love God and love neighbor, following the commandments when doing so. Yet, the young man assures Jesus that he has intently followed the commandments. Jesus gives him an additional command: to go and sell everything and give the money earned to the poor. The man goes away sad because he had many possessions, and the task would prove to be too difficult.

So how do we know if we are following Jesus' command to give away everything without actually turning over our house deed, our car title, and our 401K? The first reading from the Book of Wisdom gives us a clue. It is wisdom and prudence that will guide us in knowing that we are simplifying our lives and following the Gospel while continuing to live. Then, hopefully, we will be able to say as the prophet that we "deemed riches nothing in comparison to wisdom and prudence."

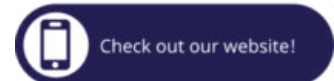

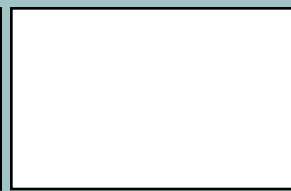
