It's The Right Thing To Do

Sometimes parents, teachers, coaches, and mentors know what we need even more than we know ourselves. A couple of weeks ago my wife, Janine, and I journeyed to Egg Harbor on a Sunday after Mass. Janine could do what she enjoys doing in Door County—shop! I could enjoy what I like to do on a Sunday afternoon in the summer—watch a Door County League baseball game, this one pitting Egg Harbor against Maplewood.

While the hometown Indians were soundly defeated by the Mets from Maplewood, it was something that happened at the game that caught my eyes, ears, and heart. A boy, age 10 or 11, was racing after every foul ball. After claiming the ball, he promptly brought each souvenir to the concession stand for his prize—fifty cents. After nearly a dozen balls had been claimed, this boy proudly stated to his family that he had retrieved all but three balls.

At that moment, with a crack of the bat, the boy was running again, beating a little girl and her brother to the foul ball. Yet, something very interesting happened next. The boy's mother instructed him to give the little girl the ball. The boy looked at his mother with an incredulous look that said, "but you don't understand! I earned this ball!" With that the mother retorted: "Give her the ball. It is the right thing to do." The right thing to do indeed. Yet, I'm not sure the boy was buying what she was selling. Which made me think: when this boy grows up and is called to be a generous community member of some Door County village or city far, far away, will he remember those words? Be generous because it's the right thing to do.

In this weekend's first reading from 1st Kings, the prophet Elijah is instructed by an angel to eat some cakes so that he will have strength for the journey. At first, Elijah looks a little side-eyed at the angel, not really believing that the angel knows what they are talking about but relents and eats the provisions. The angel is persistent and instructs Elijah a second time to eat so that he has strength for the journey. Again, Elijah eats and has the strength to carry him into the desert for forty days and nights.

In the Gospel, in this latest Bread of Life Discourse reading, Jesus is instructing the people that they will need to eat the Bread of Life in order to live. If a person eats this bread, they will not die but instead will live forever.

Sometimes we do not know what is best for us. Elijah learned that from the provisions that the angel was providing. And the followers of Jesus in John's Gospel learn that God has provided the Bread of Life, but we need to eat it in order to live. Remember the old show, Father Knows Best? Well, maybe fathers, and mothers, coaches and teachers really do know best sometimes. We sure have a lot of learning and living to do!



Taizé Prayer




