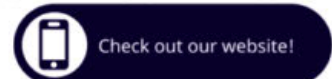

This means cutting out "for fun" purchases for a month: no buying new clothes, no eating out, no spontaneous online shopping or shopping sprees. A no-buy month is an opportunity to avoid overconsumption and materialism, be grateful for what you already have, and find abundance in simple living. It's the perfect Lenten challenge!

Not ready to try a whole no-buy month? Start with a no-buy week, or try a low-buy month instead, and set a budget or other limit on your spending.

PREPARING FOR EUCHARIST



Although the Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Mass, “the consummation of the Mass is found in Holy Communion,” (*Norms for Distribution Reception of Holy Communion, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops*) whereby the faithful consume the Body and Blood of Christ, given to the Church on the night before Jesus died. The faithful participate to the fullest extent in the celebration of Holy Mass when they receive Holy Eucharist.

In order to safeguard and provide proper care of the Eucharist, these norms are a supplement to the universal liturgical norms of the Roman Rite and the liturgical norms of the Roman Rite of the Dioceses of the United States. They are to be considered as normative within the Diocese of Green Bay and are to be strictly followed. It is desired that these norms will aid in a reverent and fruitful worship.

PREPARING OUR HEARTS

Receiving Holy Communion isn't only a ritual - it's an encounter with Christ. To be prepared:

- **Examine Your Conscience** Are you in a state of grace? Regular confession helps us come to the Eucharist with a clean heart.
- **Observe the One-Hour Fast** Abstain from food and drink (except water and medicine) for one hour before receiving.
- **Quiet Your Mind and Heart** Take time before Mass to pray and reflect.

WHO CAN RECEIVE?

- Catholics in a state of grace, meaning not guilty of grave sin, may receive the Eucharist.
- Those in need of confession should seek reconciliation before receiving.
- If unable to attend Mass, participate online at www.gbres.org/live and then contact the parish to arrange for **Holy Communion** to be brought to your home.

GROWING IN FAITH

The best way to foster love for the Eucharist is **within our faith community**:

- Pray together at home or in a parish group.
- Reflect on the beauty of the Mass.
- Encourage one another in faith.

By doing so, we honor Christ and deepen our relationship with Him. Let us approach Holy Communion with reverence, gratitude, and love!
