


Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh.

Luke 6:20-21

Woe to the Blessed

What I remember most from my time in the Dominican Republic is the way the poorest of the poor in that area somehow seemed to be the most happy and joyfilled. They told the best stories and jokes, had the tastiest food, and knew how to sing and dance! They trusted each other as neighbors to help them and were willing to listen and mourn when times were difficult. Happiness, clearly, is not directly correlated with wealth.



In our present economic and political climate the dichotomy between the rich and the poor is ever more evident to us. From the time of Jesus to our present time, the scenario of the rich and poor really has not changed dramatically. Along with wealth comes power and control. Most often the power and control is directed over other people's lives directly or indirectly. This is the point of contention with Jesus' sermon on the Beatitudes.

Jesus seems to be pushing against those who are privileged in the world who intentionally limit the well-being of others directly or through systems they have created in society. Jesus proclaims that if you are too comfortable in this world then you are probably not lifting up your neighbors in dignity and hope.

Jesus points toward those who are poor, hungry, or weeping and proclaims them to be the most favored in God's realm. The Dominicans I lived with back in the 90's, were most often excluded and insulted, yet were the ones who rejoiced and leapt for joy in the graciousness of God's presence.



Save Money — and the Planet — With a Cold-Water Wash!

Did you know that you can save money just by washing
your laundry in cold water?

According to Energy Star, about 90% of the energy used to operate a washing machine is used just to heat the water. Using cold water saves energy, which is good for the earth—and your electric bill!

Washing your laundry in cold water has benefits for your clothing, too. Cold water is less damaging to fabric fibers than hot water, so washing your clothes in cold water will extend the life of your clothes and keep them looking newer for longer. This also means that cold water is better for delicate fabrics. Washing clothes in cold water can also prevent wrinkles and reduce fading, color bleeding, microfiber shedding, and shrinkage. Cold water is also better than hot water for removing many common stains.

There are times when hot water is best: when you need to sanitize clothes or bedding; during winter, when detergents are less effective in the extra-cold water; when you have heavily soiled fabrics; and when washing certain fabrics or removing certain stains. But for the average load, you can keep it cold!
