


### 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time January 25 & 26, 2025



#### Time to Pick Up, Not Drop, the Ball

Can't you just picture the Gospel for this weekend? Jesus goes to the synagogue in his hometown of Nazareth, just like he did for years before his public ministry. After reading a scripture passage from Isaiah, as he sits down, everyone stares at him.

Can you feel the anticipation? He scans the room, seeing the faces he's known his whole life, and them them that the scripture is fulfilled in their hearing.



This was a total mic-drop-moment. The man everyone knew growing up is saying he is the anointed one, the one to bring glad tidings to the poor and prolaim liberty captives. A mic-drop indeed!

But as much as I love a good mic-drop-moment, I've definitely committed more ball-drop than mic-drop moments in my life.

Recently, I was exchanging some pictures and texts with another person I've known my whole life. It was all in good fun because we have similar views and opinions. But the other person wanted to share the content with others with different views as a way of being mischievous. I timidly tried to dissuade it from happening but sure enough, I found myself in a group text with others who I knew didn't find it funny. I allowed my voice to be quieted in a life-long relationship at the expense of someone else.

How could I have dropped the ball in bringing glad tidings to others? How could I not have followed Christ's lead by freeing others from hurt? I can do better.

Christ calls us to look up from not only reading scripture but to fulfilling its message in our daily lives. We cannot sit back quietly and not be the bearers of good tidings. It's time for me to call out the injustices and to apologize to those who are hurt by my inaction. It's time for all of us to pick up the ball and drop the mic in how we live as the anointed children of God.

#### Luke: The Story of Salvation Fulfilled



#### Save Money—and the Planet—with a **Sustainable Swap!**

If you're still using dryer sheets, consider this your sign to swap them out and save with a cleaner, greener option!

Dryer sheets are usually made out of polyester (which is derived from petroleum, a major fossil fuel) coated in a chemical solution that transfers onto your laundry; this residue accumulates on your clothes and builds up in your dryer over time, with negative effects. And because dryer sheets are single-use, they're bad for your wallet as well as the planet.

Wool dryer balls are a more sustainable solution. They soften fabric, remove static, and reduce wrinkles, as well as cut down on drying time, which will help your clothes last longer. Plus, wool dryer balls are very reusable—they'll last for around 1,000 loads!

Avoiding wool due to an allergy or because you're vegan? Try a reusable plastic dryer ball, make your own dryer balls out of old socks, or just forgo dryer aids entirely.
