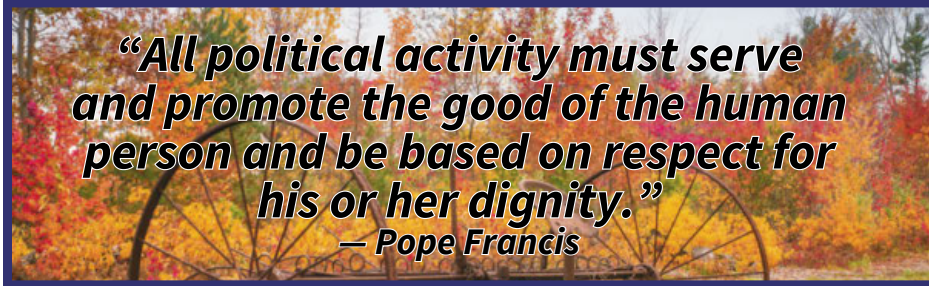

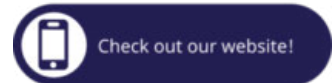

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL 2024

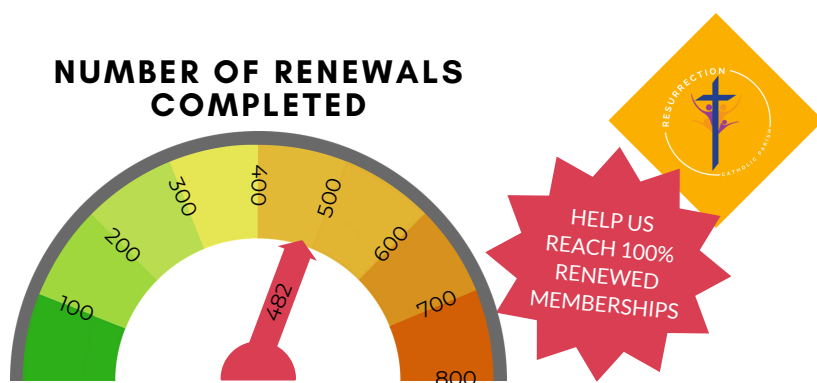
As a parish family, we are taking time to refocus on what it means to be a member of Resurrection and to help bring about our vision to Love All God's People, All the Time.

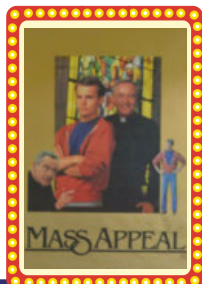

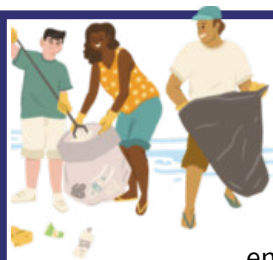

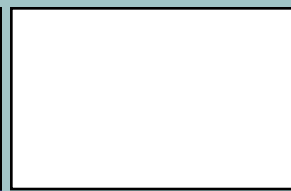
