

Ready For the Game

There is nothing like coming out of the tunnel or locker room to a crowd waiting for a game. The adrenaline is pumping. People are excited. The game is about to begin. All are ready. When I was in high school, I had this feeling before countless football games. Running into the stadium from the locker room at Carson Park in Eau Claire or Beell Stadium in Marshfield never grew old.



Years later, I had a similar experience as a Junior High Religious Education Coordinator at St. Bernard Parish in Appleton. Because we had 850 children and youth in the faith formation program, and we had several nights of faith formation classes, the most important night of the year was registration night. People had in mind the night of the week that worked best for their child and the family calendar. If they did not get their preferred night, they were not happy. So, hundreds of people lined the halls of the faith formation center, waiting for the registration process to begin. Every year I felt like Jordan Love coming out of the tunnel at Lambeau Field, walking through the lines of parents, filled with adrenaline for the process that was about to begin. Of course, when the parents did not receive the night they desired, they wanted to crucify me, the other coordinators, and our director.

This weekend, as we enter Holy Week, we have that same dynamic in our Gospel readings. This is the only Sunday of the Church year that we hear two Gospel readings. In the Gospel, at the procession with palms, we once again hear about Jesus and the disciples triumphantly entering the city of Jerusalem. People were placing cloaks on the ground and waving palm branches while shouting: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest." Adrenaline was high. People were excited. Jesus was ready for the week.

Yet, the story does not end there. Like the parent who did not receive the desired faith formation night for his or her child, the crowd, with the stirrings of the religious leaders, would turn on Jesus, ultimately leading to his passion and death. We hear the entire story in the passion narrative from Luke's Gospel.


