


# The Epiphany of the Lord January 4 & 5, 2024



### The Lesson of the Magi

Can you believe the 12 Days of Christmas ends this weekend? While we may not have received a partridge in a pear tree or five golden rings, nor the myrrh or frankincense from the Magi, this is the time to reflect upon what the season did bring us. Only a few days ago, Resurrection was bursting at the seams with our parish family and friends. We were presented with a great opportunity of joyfully welcoming all people. Now the question remains, can we maintain that sense of hospitality all year round, not only at church but also in our lives?

When the Magi followed the star to the house in Bethlehem and found Jesus with Mary, they were able to enter and worship Christ. Gentile strangers were welcomed into a Jewish home. The Epiphany of the Lord highlights the universality of Christ for all people. The door to Christ was opened for all who wish to enter. How glorious it is that God is for everyone, no matter what! The Epiphany calls us into relationship with each other.

What adds to this remarkable event is where it is located in scripture. The Gospel of Luke was written for the gentile audience, aimed to present the Gospel of the Lord to all people. Luke was inclusive in his message of Jesus, especially those marginalized or without a Jewish background. It would make sense that the Magi account would be found in Luke. But it's not. We find the story in the Gospel of Matthew.

The Gospel of Matthew was written to resonate with the Jewish people. Through the use of scripture and tradition, Matthew emphasizes Jesus as the Messiah, the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies, and tension between love and law. Knowing Matthew wished to maintain Jewish tradition, why would a story of gentiles be included?

Could the visitation of the Magi be a reminder to us to welcome all who are in search of Christ, whether they know it or not? Do we open our minds and hearts to those who are not of the same background or mindset as us and offer joyous hospitality? And I don't just mean at Resurrection. The Epiphany of the Lord calls us into radical welcoming and loving all people, all the time. Let us receive the message of The Epiphany and bring it into our daily lives.



#### Sleep in Heavenly Peace Book Drive



Mackenzie, a Resurrection youth, began collecting books because she believes every child that receives a bed should also receive a bedtime story.






