Multiplying Love

During my teaching days, I loved taking students on field trips. It was exciting to provide experiences for children outside of the classroom. However, the one aspect I never enjoyed was packing a bag lunch. Looking back, it was a selfish attitude to grumble about having to pack a lunch that didn't have to be refrigerated and all items were disposable. At that time, I just saw it as an inconvenience.



Now I see a simple bag lunch differently. Most people don't give much thought to a sandwich, a bag of chips, a piece of fruit, and a dessert packed into a paper bag. We've all had this lackluster meal, but to someone who hasn't eaten all day, it's a welcome blessing. Since May, I've had the privilege of joining the StreetLights Outreach team in providing these simple bagged meals to our brothers and sisters experiencing homelessness. While offering food to calm a rumbling tummy, we are also able to be a positive presence to those we meet. Conversations and relationships have formed over this simple meal.

And the team expands beyond those gathered and walking the sidewalks of Green Bay. Numerous people have answered the call to share without having to go downtown. Just when we begin to wonder if there is enough food for the night, surprise! We find unexpected sandwiches in the refrigerator or boxes of chips at the parish doors. It has been a wonder of multiplication.

Jesus knew something about feeding the hungry. As he looked out upon the 5000+ hungry people before him, Jesus knew what he had to do. He took five simple loaves and two fish, blessed them, fed everyone, and still had leftovers. Without the cooperation of the few who shared what little they had, this miracle could not have taken place. Generosity was asleep within the crowds and resources were waiting to be called forth. Once those following Jesus opened their hearts and gave of themselves, God multiplied their love for each other. Simple actions of sharing created a ripple effect of comforting many.

Can you imagine the conversations and relationships made over this meal shared on the hillside in Galilee? Can you imagine the possibilities if we opened our hearts a little more? How can God multiply the gifts we bring to share with others?

Now when I see a simple brown paper bag lunch, I see the many hearts that went into making it possible and the multiplication of love.


